

Competency Pronouncements (COMPs)

COMPs set out the competencies and professional skills, knowledge, ethics, values and attitudes required by the public sector auditor to undertake audits in line with the ISSAIs. COMPs are further distinguished between COMP standards and principles, and GUIDS. The work already undertaken within INTOSAI community regarding the competency framework will form the basis for developing COMPs in the future.

The creation of FIPP is intended to ensure a single entry into the IFPP.

- Ensure quality of the full set of INTOSAI professional standards.
- Strengthen the INTOSAI as a standard setter.
- Drive the continued development of appropriate standards for public-sector auditing.



Governance structure of the FIPP

PSC Steering Committee is responsible for the governance of FIPP. The PSC Steering Committee includes the chairs of the PSC, CBC and KSC. The PSC Steering Committee ensures that FIPP contributes to reliable and effective standard setting in accordance with the key strategies defined for goal 1 in INTOSAI's Strategic Plan.

INTOSAI Framework of Professional Pronouncement (IFPP)

- The INTOSAI Framework of Professional Pronouncements (IFPP) are the formal and authoritative announcements or declarations of the INTOSAI Community. All professional pronouncements are developed and approved through a due process before they are presented to INCOSAI for endorsement. The purpose of IFPP is to improve the credibility of INTOSAI's professional pronouncements, by making them an authoritative framework for public sector auditing and enhancing their technical quality.
- The INTOSAI Professional Pronouncements consist of INTOSAI Principles (INTOSAI-P), International Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI), INTOSAI Guidance (GUID) and Competency Pronouncements (COMP).



Key Features of IFPP



Recognition of the historical importance and aspirational nature of the founding and core INTOSAI principles, at both the organisational and engagement level.



Recognition that there are pronouncements other than ISSAIs.



Retention of ISSAI brand to refer to INTOSAI standards .



ISSAI 100 placed at the top of the ISSAI hierarchy in recognition of its centrality in operationalizing the INTOSAI Principles.



Identification of the pronouncements that need to be implemented by a SAI for ISSAI compliance.



Clear vertical and horizontal linkages through the classification criteria and the numbering system.



IFPP primarily intended for SAIs, either at the SAI organisational level or at the engagement level. Space delineated in the GUID section in the IFPP for organisational level guidance.



Merger of INTOSAI-GOVs into guidance category after undertaking review to ensure that they address directly SAIs and/or auditors.



Provision for future development of competency principles, standards and guidance.

Strategic Development Plan for the INTOSAI Framework of Professional Pronouncements

The Strategic Development Plan (SDP) for the INTOSAI Framework of Professional Pronouncements is a new planning instrument, setting out a general strategy and working plan for the development of the framework towards a clear, consistent and adequate set of professional pronouncements. The introduction of the SDP is a result of the efforts made in 2014-2016 under goal 1 of INTOSAI Strategic Plan to evaluate and strengthen our standard-setting processes.

The SDP for IFPP is aimed at assembling all initiatives to develop, revise or withdraw professional pronouncements. The planning process includes public consultations to encourage input from all interested parties as a minimum once in every three years. The PSC and the chairs of the CBC and KSC ascertain that all relevant needs are addressed by the SDP in line with the objectives of goal 1, 2 and 3 of INTOSAI's strategic plan. FIPP takes the initiative to propose amendments and updates to the plan as needed. The PSC consults with all affected parties before the plan is finalised and presented to the INTOSAI Governing Board for endorsement.
